



Nursing, M.S.N. (Online)

Have a bachelor of nursing? The MSN program provides educational mobility and preparation in nursing at the graduate level to qualified registered nurses. The nursing faculty is committed to excellence in developing masters prepared nurses!

Nursing offers a 32-semester hour Master of Science in Nursing with a focus for bachelor of nursing prepared registered nurses. The curriculum, designed to build on the student's previous education and experience, prepares nurses for professional nursing practice.

Major areas of emphasis include:

- » Advanced practice roles
- » Cultural competencies
- » Theories
- » Technology
- » Research
- » Evidence-based practice
- » Issues in nursing practice

The minimum time required to complete the program is three academic semesters (10 months), provided the student meets all other program, graduate college and university requirements.

- » Students working full-time typically complete the program in six semesters (two academic years).
- Students may take a maximum of six years to complete the program after enrolling in nursing courses with field experiences.
- » Most of the degree is available in an online option!

Nutritional Sciences B.S.

Dietetics is the high-tech science of applying food and nutrition principles to personal and community health!

The Registered Dietitian is the only nationally recognized credential in foods, nutrition, and dietetics, and is recognized as the nutrition expert in health care, nutritional counseling, food production, sales and the media. Most employment in the healthcare industry requires the R.D. credential. Jobs with the most potential for advancement are closed to nutritionists, who are not registered dietitians.

Allied Health option students complete prerequisite courses needed to apply to a wide variety of healthcare professional programs or graduate school.

- Students receiving a degree in Nutritional Sciences - Allied Health option will be competitive because their educational experience brings a special dimension to their overall knowledge of the relationship of nutrition to health.
- The Allied Health option within the Nutritional Sciences program will allow students to utilize this bachelor degree to meet prerequisites for a variety of health professional programs, including:

Occupational Therapy, M.S.

One of only two OT programs in the state of Oklahoma!

Our small class sizes, with a cohort of 20 students a year, means that we can focus on training high-quality occupational therapists for the rural region of Eastern Oklahoma.

- » 100% pass rate on NBCOT certification exam (as of 2019-2020)
- Join the Student Occupational Therapy Association (SOTA)! Students in SOTA participate in community service projects throughout the year including:
 - Helping with prom for Oklahoma School for the Blind
 - Running a sensory booth for a non-profit event
 - Food and clothing drives

The student organization prepares students for involvement in state and national organizations after graduation.

The curriculum consists of 81 hours and is a 30-month program.

Organizational Leadership B.S (Online)

The B.S. in Organizational Leadership is part of the statewide initiative, Reach Higher- Oklahoma's Degree Completion Program!

NSU is one of seven regional universities participating in this unique program specifically designed for working adults.

Core courses will be taught in an eight-week format online.

Students must

- > Have an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree or 72 credit hours
- » Be 21 years of age
- Have a minimum of 2.0 graduation/ retention GPA in past college coursework.

Physician Assistant Studies, M.S.

The 27-month Physician Assistant Studies curriculum requires 110 credit hours to graduate with a Master of Science in Physician Assistant Studies. The PA program is housed on the NSU Muskogee campus.

Public Health, M.P.H. (90% Online)

The Master of Public Health program is a postbaccalaureate program with two pathways:

- » Public Health Leadership
- » Global Health

The program accepts both full and part-time students and provides students with knowledge essential to the practice of public health on a global scale.

Students develop a strong foundation in public health by studying biostatistics, environmental health issues, epidemiology, health policy and management and social and behavioral determinants of health, as well as study in specialization areas so graduates gain the expertise necessary to address some of the world's most pressing problems.

RN to BSN Program

Ready for the next step in your nursing career?

The Nursing, B.S.N. degree provides registered nurses (R.N.s) a 30 credit-hour upper-division program leading to a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree! The mission of the program is to provide educational mobility for associate degree and diploma-prepared nurses and to provide preparation for graduate education in nursing. The curriculum, designed to build on the student's previous education and experience, prepares nurses for professional nursing practice. Areas of program emphasis are family nursing, community health, leadership and research.

Graduates are prepared to:

- » Provide primary health care in diverse settings
- » Provide education to individuals, families and community groups
- » To continue lifelong learning

The minimum time required to complete the program is 10 months, provided the student meets all other Nursing and University graduation requirements.

» Students working full-time typically complete the program in 16 months.

















- Students may take a maximum of five years to complete the program after enrolling in nursing courses.
- » All nursing classes are online!
- > Our schedule is designed to meet the needs of full-time working nurses!

Speech-language pathology is the study of disorders that affect a person's speech, language, cognition, voice, swallowing and the treatment of these disorders and diseases.

The Bachelor of Science in Speech-Language Pathology provides pre-professional undergraduate education as a prerequisite for admission to a master's degree program in communication disorders.

Speech-Language Pathology, M.S.

The graduate program in Speech-Language Pathology provides students with academic and clinical practicum experiences necessary for a career in various work settings available to a Speech-Language Pathologist.

Students who complete the master of science degree will have the academic and minimum 400 clinical practicum hours necessary to meet requirements for the:

- The Certificate of Clinical Competence in Speech-Language Pathology from the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association
- License in speech-language pathology from Oklahoma State Board of Examiners for Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology
- The Oklahoma State Department of Education Standard Certificate in Speech-Language Pathology
