• Dr. Debbie Landry - Gray & Associates Summary

Gray & Associates were on campus August 22-23, with preliminary work done by NSU employees over the Spring and Summer. Department chairsand some assistant and associate deans were in attendance during these meetings. They examined a 70 mile circle around our campus, including Tahlequah and Broken Arrow, and a larger radius of where students come from. A large percentage come



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from Oklahoma, but some are from the Dallas and St. Louis areas as well. They looked at the degrees we offer and the job market for these majors. There is a need to know where our graduates are working and how much they're making. They also used Google hits from around the nation of when a particular job or career is searched multiple times, along with those searching for NSU, and the searchfor competitors offering the same degrees. We used IPEDS data during this visit for what programs would we grow, sustain, fix, or sunset and Gray & Associates shared data of the outcomes. NSU stakeholders voted on potential programs/degrees to consider in the future and the highest number of votes for Master's programs were Cyber Security/Information Assurance, Marriage and Family Therapy/Counseling, Computer Science, Educational/Instructional Technology (Teaching Online K-12), and Public Relations/Image Management. The highest number of votes for Bachelor's programs were Computer Software Engineering, ESL Language Instructor (TESOL), Organizational Behavior Studies, Management Science (Data Analytics), and Crisis/Emergency/Disaster Management. More evaluation continues and there is a need for deans to share this information with faculty. The data discovered Oklahoma State University is our top competitor, followed by the University of Oklahoma, and Arkansas Tech University.
