The meeting was called to order by President Cambiano in CASE 134 at 3:01 p.m. on March 1, 2019. There was Zoomaccess in Tahlequah to Broken Arrow BAAS 215 and Muskogee NSM 112.

Guests (Time is typically set aside for administrators who wish to address the council):

Brandon Martin (Systems Librarian in BA) spoke on the library's Interlibrary Loan (ILL) program. ILL is basically a service to students, faculty, and staff to provide access to materials not owned by NSU. Illiad (the interlibrary loan system) is outdated and the library will be transitioning to a new provider, TiPasa (but it will not be advertised under this name) – we will be referring



to this merely as "Interlibrary Loan." There will no longer be the need to create an individual account. Everyone will already be in the system (Banner) with single sign-on, text notifications, web responsive and mobile design, and a simpler interface for everyone to use. Cloud based, integrated with everything else that library has (one suite that will communicate well with our entire system) and will not require a server. Remove a barrier of entry (no sign-up, a part of NSU account). Simple, can do from your phone and will be a better patron experience. Transitioning in May (right after finals) with a tentative "live" date of the first week of June. No set date yet, but TCC did it a few years ago and it only took a few weeks for them, so we hope to be ready to go by June. Questions: please contact Brandon Martin (x6450, or martin70@nsuok.edu).

Provost Landry wants President Cambiano to meet and have a further discussion about where to place this information. Delegate Waters-Bilbo is really wanting it to be on the syllabus. An extended discussion ensued. A motion was made and seconded to have this information included on the syllabus as a workable and updated link with a brief, one-sentence description. The motion passed.
