

Faculty Council February 1, 2019Minutes

The meeting was called to order by President Cambiano in CASE 134 at 3:02 p.m. on Feburary 1, 2019. There was Zoomaccess in Tahlequah to Broken Arrow 215 and Muskogee 112.

IV. Old Business Items:

A. Help Students -

Discussion centered around the fact that enrollment and recruiting are up, but retention is down. President Cambiano



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will request permission to receive a breakdown of part time vs. full time enrollment, as well as retention by program. There was also discussion about the importance for faculty to engage with students in a meaningful way, where connections could be made through face-to-face office hours, Zoom office hours, etc. A faculty call to action was suggested and was well received for faculty to get outside their comfort zone to engage with students outside of class. Other discussion centered around the need for a campus day care facility and a shuttle system that runs between all three campuses.

All of the universities in the Tulsa area except University of Oklahoma are participating in this project. A steering committee is looking at various dimensions with President Cambiano and Dr. Kat Shahan are looking at transfer rates of students entering NSU from TCC. They are looking at expectations of admin and senior faculty of support of transfer students and assumptions of the faculty role but not the expectation of follow-through. Surveys, focus groups, and interviews have been conducted. Once they assimilate to NSU, they need to be viewed as RiverHawks, not transfer students from another institution. President Cambiano will request to share this report.

D. Reimbursement (Delegate Melles)

From the Department of Counseling - those who are teaching Master's Thesis hours, or other courses out of course load, are finding there is a lack of reimbursement for this work. President Cambiano will speak to the Academic Council about this.



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E. OSRHE Driven Conversation about Online Program/Courses - Quality Online Instruction

The statewide plans for an e-Campus portal was mentioned by President Turner during the Brown Bag discussions this week. We are currently seeing a need for quality online instruction and are a model for Quality Matters (QM) and Review of Online Courses (ROC) at NSU. Moving forward there will likely be a need for etiquette for online courses, especially live video sessions conducted through Zoom.
