Open Educational Resources (OER) - Jerol Skinner, Sarah Whittle, Pamela Louderback, & Alesha Baker.

Alesha Baker provided a recap of what OERs are. There is a general

consensus that faculty are concerned about the quality of these kind of resources. She shared a reminder about how this is a cost savings measure to our students. Jerol Skinner pointed delegates to the CTL Website for funding opportunities

https://academics.nsuok.edu/teachingandlearning/Funds- Awards Delegate Louderback shared about the Council of Online Excellence sub-committee of grant funding at the state level and a possible partnership with another university in Arkansas in the future. Secretary Whittle provided information about incremental implementation of OERs and the help librarians provide. Questions were posed about another date/time for a second webinar; how to incorporate funding for pre-existing content with new additions. OER is a statewide initiative (COLE), therefore it is a campus initiative and a tremendous cost savings opportunity to our students. Campus administrators are in support of this being the faculty's choice.

Josh Rader - Syllabus additions

Delegate Waters shared about the research of Dr. Sara Goldrick-Rab, a sociologist who is looking for ways to make collegeaffordable. Mr. Rader discussed the variety of needs our students face: some are homeless, some are living out of their car,

some do not have money for food, or cannot buy appropriate clothing for a job interview. Sometimes our resources for assistance include those with offcampus partners. On the Tahlequah and Broken Arrow campuses there is a Rowdy's Resource Room for free distribution of food, personal hygiene items, school supplies, and clothing. There are also mental health resources on both the Tahlequah and Broken Arrow campuses. The Light the Way scholarship is also set up to helpaddress these needs. There is a link for "Report Concern" on the bottom of all NSU webpages, which is sent to Behavioral Intervention Team (BIT).

There was a proposal from Delegate Waters for a link to Student Services to be included in all syllabi for Fall 2019.
