





Study Hours

All three of our chapters require up to 10 weekly study hours, depending upon GPA. These are set to help New Members make the transition between high school and college.

New Member Meetings



Sorority Life

Glossary

Active: An initiated member of a sorority who has completed the new member process.

Alumna: An initiated member who is no longer a active member of the chapter.

Badge: The pin of an initiated member.

Bid: A formal invitation to join a sorority.

Bid Day: The last day of recruitment when new members accept their bids and officially join their new organizations.

Bid Matching: A system of matching potential member's preferences with sororities' preferences.

Chapter: A local group of a national sorority.

Formal Recruitment: A series of parties hosted by each sorority during a specific period, which are scheduled and governed by the Panhellenic Council.

Greeks: Members of a Greek-letter fraternity/sorority.

Hazing: Persecuting or harassing with humiliating tasks, words, or actions. Forbidden by Northeastern State University, and punishable by law.

Floor: A chapter's living or meeting facility.

Initiation: The formal ceremony during which a new member takes her formal vow for full membership into a sorority.

Legacy: A prospective member whose sister, mother, or grandmother is an alumna or active member of a particular sorority. A sorority is not obligated to give bids to legacies, but each group has their own policy.

Office of Fraternity/Sorority Life: A division of Student Engagement to better serve the needs of Fraternities& Sororities. Sometimes called Greek Affairs.

National Panhellenic Council: An organization of national sororities, which meets regularly to share concerns and provide mutual solutions.

New Member: A woman who has accepted a bid from a sorority but has not yet been initiated.

Panhellenic Council: A representative governing body of sororities affiliated with the National Panhellenic Conference.

Philanthropy: A charitable cause undertaken by Greek chapters on campus, community, or national level.

Potential New Member(PNM): An collegiate woman interested in participating in formal or informal recruitment.

Sister: A term used by sorority members to refer to one another.

Sorority: A group of women joined together in friendship for leadership and academic purpose.

Campus Total: The allowable chapter size, as determined by college Panhellenic, including both new members and active members.











Sorority FAQ

Is it possible to be in a sorority and still keep up with grades?

OF COURSE! Did you know Greek GPAs, on average, are some of the highest on campus? Scholarship is a core value of all Greek organizations. You are a student first!

Do I have to live on the sorority floor?

Generally, each chapter requires each member to live on the floor for 2-4 semesters. All groups have exception policies if you're a commuter, or you already have a lease or housing agreement. Typically, sophomores and above live on the floor.

Do I have to pay my dues monthly or can I pay them in full at the beginning of the semester?

Each sorority allows you the opportunity to pay your dues in full at the beginning of the semester, but also allows the option to pay the monthly amount if you wish to do so.

Where do my dues go?

Sorority dues pay for philanthropy events, national dues, sisterhood events, and recruitment activities. Each chapter has listed their monthly amount in the information section of this handbook.

Can I get involved on campus being in a sorority?

Sorority life is about getting involved on campus and in the community! Most organizations want you to be involved in 2-3 other student organizations besides sororities. Being involved on campus is a key to college success.



Potential New Member's Bill of Rights

- The right to be treated as an individual
- The right to be fully informed about the recruitment process
- The right to ask questions and receive true and objective answers from recruitment counselors and members
- The right to be treated with respect
- The right to be treated as a capable and mature person without being patronized
- The right to ask how and why and receive straight answers
- The right to have and express opinions to recruitment counselors
- The right to have inviolable confidentiality when sharing information with recruitment counselors
- The right to make informed choices without undue pressure from others
- The right to be fully informed about the NPC Unanimous Agreements implicit in the membership recruitment acceptance binding agreement (MRABA) signing process
- The right to make one's own choice and decision and accept full responsibility for the results of that decision
- The right to have a positive, safe and enriching recruitment and new member experience

NSU HAZING POLICY

Northeastern State University does not tolerate acts of hazing by individuals or organization members.

Hazing is any action taken or any situation created intentionally that causes embarrassment, harassment, or ridicule, and risks emotional and or physical harm to members of a group or team, whether new or not, regardless of the person's willingness to participate. The express or implied consent of the victim will not be a defense. Apathy or acquiescence in the presence of hazing is not considered a neutral act; they are violations of this rule. No student group or any person associated with any group sanctioned or authorized by the Northeastern State University shall engage or participate in hazing.

Student groups shall be assumed to be responsible for the actions of their members or associates for hazing violations.

Hazing should be reported to Student Affairs immediately
