

Financial Aid & Scholarships Help Fund Your Education

In 2019-2020, NSU awarded over \$66 million in financial assistance in the form of scholarships, grants, part-time work, tuition waivers and education loans.

NSU has the lowest cost when compared with the three leading public residential four-year colleges in Oklahoma.

Financial need and merit are the main factors considered for the awarding of grants and scholarships. "Merit-based" aid is awarded to students who do well in academics, leadership and community service. "Need-based" aid is given to students who lack the financial resources needed to go to college.

FINANCIAL AID

Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as soon as possible after Oct. 1. You can sign up for your FSA I.D. and apply online at fsaid.ed.gov. State grants will be awarded on a first come, first serve basis starting Oct. 1 until funds are depleted.

Foundation Scholarships

DEADLINE MARCH 1

This scholarship application allows students to apply for a variety of privately funded awards from the NSU Foundation.

Incoming Freshmen may qualify for one of the listed scholarships. These awards may also be stacked with Oklahoma's Promise funding.

In-State Incoming Freshmen are automatically considered for Freshmen General Scholarships when they complete their admission application. Students admitted before Feb. 1 will be offered the highest scholarship listed in the chart based on their qualifications.

Students admitted after Feb. 1 will be awarded if funding is available.

Amounts may vary, depending on hours enrolled, and on campus living status.

Want an early scholarship decision?

Students that have been regularly admitted by Dec. 1 and are eligible for a Freshmen General Scholarship will receive a scholarship offer by the end of December.

Incoming transfer students can receive one of the listed scholarships. These awards may also be stacked with Oklahoma's Promise funding. All scholarships are limited in number, therefore, students are encouraged to apply on or before the deadline. Students must be Oklahoma Residents to receive these awards. Students must be admitted by May 1 to be eligible for scholarships.

*Recipients for this award are nominated by their Smart Choice College President (CASC, CSC, NEO, EOSC).

**Applicants must be current participants in the Tulsa Achieves program to be eligible.

***Eligible students must be transferring from one of our five Smart Choice institutions and meet the academic criteria listed.

+Oklahoma residents transferring to NSU from any other institution may be eligible for this award based on their academic credentials.

TYPES OF SCHOLARSHIPS:

Tuition Waivers:

NSU awarded over \$6 million in tuition waivers last year! This scholarship waives a specified amount of a student's tuition costs. Fees are charged separately from tuition, and are therefore not covered by this type of award.

Foundation Scholarships:

The Foundation awarded \$875,101 in scholarships last year! These scholarships are privately funded awards from NSU's Foundation. The money from these awards can apply towards any charges on a student's account.

Housing Waivers:

This scholarship waives a specified amount of a student's on campus housing costs.

Outside Scholarships:

Money that comes from outside of NSU can be awarded in many different ways. Those donors have control over the way in which their money is applied, and NSU will apply the funding accordingly.

Oklahoma's Promise:

This state funding is calculated according to NSU's tuition costs and the student's enrollment in any given semester. The awards are figured based on a student's cost of attendance and financial need. Funding from Oklahoma's Promise can be combined with NSU scholarships.
