

# CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT

## at Northeastern State University

### HOW TO ENROLL

#### STEP 1: APPLY FOR ADMISSION TO NSU

Apply for admission to NSU at [apply.nsuok.edu](https://apply.nsuok.edu) and select the **High School Concurrent** student type.

*Make sure you pay the \$25 non-refundable student application fee!*

#### STEP 2: COMPLETE CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT AGREEMENT FORM

Meet with your high school counselor for assistance with the Concurrent Enrollment Agreement Form.

Once complete, please submit it to the **Office of Admission & Recruitment**.

*Please note you will have to submit this form every semester you take courses at NSU.*

#### STEP 3: SUBMIT HIGH SCHOOL TRANSCRIPT & TEST SCORES

Submit an official high school transcript and your ACT/SAT scores (Pre-ACT and PSAT scores are also accepted) to the **Office of Admissions & Recruitment**. Official transcripts must be sent directly through an electronic transcript portal or in a sealed envelope from the high school.

*Please note that if your high school does not include your test scores on your transcript, they will need to be sent directly from ACT or the College Board SAT.*

Once all documents have been received by the **Office of Admissions & Recruitment**, you will receive an admissions decision within 7-8 business days via mail.

#### STEP 4: SCHEDULE YOUR ADVISING APPOINTMENT

Once admitted to **NSU**, schedule an appointment with an academic advisor. They will assist you your class selection, enrollment and walk you through any remaining steps before classes begin. Please contact the **University Advising Center** at **918.444.3253** to schedule your appointment.



# ABOUT CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT

1. High school juniors and seniors are eligible to take concurrent classes.  
To be admitted, you must meet one of the following requirements:
  - a. 3.0 unweighted GPA and a class rank in the top 50% OR
  - b. Minimum ACT 20 (composite) score or SAT 1030 (Total) score

*Please note that if you do not have ACT subject subscores of a 19 or SAT subject subscores of a 510, you may not be eligible to take some NSU courses. Please speak with our Concurrent Academic Advisor about your options.*

2. High school juniors and seniors may enroll in a combined number of high school and college courses per semester not to exceed a full-time workload of 19 hours (Example: 1/2 high school credit = 3 hours).

3. High school seniors, who are Oklahoma residents, may receive up to 18 hours of tuition waived.  
High school juniors, who are Oklahoma residents, may receive up to 9 hours of tuition waived.

*Please note that you are still required to pay for fees and books.*

4. If you are enrolled in concurrent classes at NSU in the fall or spring semester of your senior year and are in good academic standing, you will have the opportunity to be automatically admitted as a freshman to NSU without having to reapply.

*Please note that ACT/SAT test scores\* are required for all automatic tuition waivers and scholarships. You will be given the opportunity to provide new or updated ACT/SAT scores. Also, be sure to submit your final high school transcript after graduation.*

*\*Pre-ACT and PSAT test scores do not satisfy this requirement.*
