- Dr. Iain Anderson, Interim Assistant Vice President for Academic Affairs Researcher access to student email address lists
 - There is no written policy for how students are contacted to participate in and be contacted by researchers. The goal is to expedite the researcher's process, as well as maintain students' privacy and guard against survey fatigue, and have consistency and transparency for all parties involved.
 - Conversation centered around questions of timeliness, the number of approvers required, and constraints with the IRB process timeline. This will likely not take as long as it appears, since it's a tailored request. Drs. Anderson and Fly will discuss timelines further, but Anderson estimates this will only take a couple of days. He is open to adjusting the order of this procedure so the IRB committee can precede these new, proposed steps. The recommendation is for Dr. Anderson to pass this along to the Policy Committee next.
