Grant Information:

The Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant program provides up to \$4,000 per year (\$16,000 total for a 4-year program) in grants to undergraduate students who commit to (1) teaching full-time, (2) teaching in a high-need subject area (3) for at least 4 years within 8 calendar years of completing the program for which you receive the grant, and (4) teach at schools that serve students from low-income families. Graduate students may be eligible for \$4,000 per year (\$8,000) total with the same commitment. If the commitment is not fulfilled, the grant will be permanently converted into a loan to be repaid by the recipient. The loan will be an unsubsidized Direct Federal Stafford Loan with interest that is capitalized; meaning interest is calculated from the time of the grant disbursement.

To determine eligibility for this grant, you must:

- Have already completed the FAFSA for the academic year for which you are applying for this grant,
- Have declared or intend to declare an undergrad major in a high need teaching field of Early Childhood Ed, English Ed, Elementary Ed, Math Ed, Science Ed, Spanish, Special Ed, or Cherokee Ed OR have a graduate major of Early Childhood Ed, Reading Ed, Math Ed, Science Ed, or Special Ed.
- Be enrolled in courses that are necessary for your major
- Have a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25 on a 4.0 scale OR
- Have scored above the 75th percentile on an admissions test such as the SAT, ACT, GRE or MAT You must also:
 - Complete the TEACH grant counseling at https://studentaid.gov/app/launchTeach.action
 - Sign a TEACH grant Agreement to Serve or Repay (Agreement), each year at https://studentaid.gov/app/launchTeach.action
 - Teach for at least four years within 8 calendar years of completing your program in a school serving low-income families (view the annual school directory at https://studentaid.gov/app/tcliDirectorySearch.action)
 - Provide documentation to the U.S. Department of Education each year that you completed your teaching obligation.

one of the majors listed above.

Student Certification:

I understand that the TEACH grant program has specific service obligations that must be met in order for the award to remain as a grant. If I fail to meet all of the conditions of the award or if the service is not documented as required, I understand that the award will permanently convert to an unsubsidized Direct Federal Loan and that I will be responsible to repay this loan with interest calculated from the disbursement date of the grant. I also understand that once a TEACH grant is converted to a loan; it cannot be converted back to a grant.
