

The mission of the Northeastern State University Faculty Council is to promote communication and cooperation among the faculty and between the faculty and the administration. The Council serves as the faculty's collective voice in shared governance in order to achieve excellence in the academic endeavors of the university. Toward this goal the Council seeks to enhance the university's pursuit and dissemination of knowledge by promoting and preserving academic freedom and integrity, encouraging creative inquiry, and recognizing scholarly achievement. The Council further serves to foster the professional development and economic well-being of the faculty ~ Adopted by the Council, February 6, 2004.

The meeting was called to order by President Renee Cambiano in Bagley 243 at 3:00 p.m. on May 5, 2017. There was Zoom access in Tahlequah and Broken Arrow.

Guests (Time is typically set aside for administrators who wish to address the council):

Tom Jackson addressed the Council. The RTP Task Force is presenting its first revision. A revised Appendix C was presented to Faculty Council earlier in the week. The objective was to produce an easily understood document. The new Appendix C without Appendix C2 is to be used along with Department criteria in annual reviews. The aim is to make the portfolio process transparent and consistent from chairs to mentoring committee evaluations. There should not be surprises in the RTP process. Six components of the Boyer process were added to the document along with quotes for each of the areas of scholarship following the Boyer model. NSU's Strategic plan refers to the Teacher/Scholar model. There was a suggestion that there is a need to build in accountability for the administration to follow the policies in the Faculty Handbook. It needs to be somewhere in the process, but probably not in Appendix C. There was also discussion of how these documents can be compiled and the drawbacks of Digital Measures in terms of formats. There are still questions about a mandate for using Digital Measures. A survey of faculty pointed out inconsistencies on campus in using RTP policies from the Faculty Handbook and Appendix C.

Chad McLane addressed the Council. He answered questions about the new BlackBoard. The Content Collection is missing or hard to find. One course had students from two years ago in it. Spring is still on the old system. Course evaluations from this spring will be on the old system and will need archived. They will only be available until June. When you archive a course, do not change the name. The course will not load with a changed name.

Shannon Bridgman and Ken Jones addressed the Council concerning the American Democracy Project. This is a committee under Academic Affairs. It is part of the Campus Compact which was signed many years ago. We are already ahead of other campuses. We are doing lots of civic action and community engagement. The main aim of the committee is to work on communication. There are three components: student engagement, faculty engagement, and Student Affairs engagement. Most of what faculty do is built in to Faculty Activity Reports. There seems to be a problem with the information getting from faculty reports to chair reports and then to dean reports. The committee has a proposal to use some graduate students to gather data and help with the information flow. It was suggested that we use Digital Measures to avoid multiple data



uploads. The Committee has been working with no budget or resources, but has developed a well thought out and detailed plan. There is some new software being purchased for data analytics which could help with the data flow problems.

There was a motion made to support this revision of Appendix C. It was seconded and the motion passed.

Chanslor asked for names for the committee. Bekkering volunteered to serve as a representative of Faculty Council. There was no other discussion of the Faculty Advising Model.

Sarah Whittle volunteered to fill the vacancy left by the retirement of West. Whittle was elected unanimously.

#### B.Teacher/Scholar model

The Faculty Welfare Committee: Diamantopoulos, Louderback, and Ron Cambiano presented the Teacher/Scholar model document. Several areas of the document were read and the general consensus is that it is an excellent document. A motion was made to accept the document. The motion passed. The document will now be submitted to the Executive Cabinet.

The Administrator survey has been distributed to faculty and responses will be compiled and distributed.
