HOW TO ENROLL

☐ STEP 1: Apply for Admission to NSU

Apply for admission to **NSU** by selecting the **High School Concurrent** student type.

Complete the application for admission to **NSU** at **apply.nsuok.edu** and pay the **\$25** student application fee.

☐ STEP 2: Complete Concurrent Enrollment Agreement Form

Meet with your high school counselor for assistance with the completion of the Concurrent Enrollment Agreement form. Once complete, please submit it to the **Office of Admissions and Recruitment**.

☐ STEP 3: Submit High School Transcript & Test Scores

Submit an official high school transcript and your ACT/SAT scores (Pre-ACT and PSAT scores are accepted for highschool juniors) to the **Office of Admissions and Recruitment**. Official transcripts must be sent directly through an electronic transcript portal or in a sealed envelope from the high school.

Please note that if your high school does not include your scores on your transcript, they will need to be sent directly from ACT or the College Board SAT.

Once all documents have been received by **Admissions and Recruitment**, you will receive an admissions decision within 5-7 business days via mail.

☐ STEP 4: Schedule Your Advising Appointment

Once admitted to **NSU**, schedule an appointment with an academic advisor. They will assist with your class selection, enrollment, and walk you through any remaining steps before classes begin. Please contact the **University Advising Center** at **918.444.3253** to schedule your appointment.

ABOUT CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT

- 1. High school juniors and seniors are eligible to take concurrent classes. To be admitted, a student must meet these requirements:
 - » 3.0 GPA and a class rank in the top 50%
 - » Minimum ACT 20 (composite) score or SAT 1030 (Evidence Based Reading & Writing + Math) score
- 2. High school seniors, who are Oklahoma residents, may receive up to 18 hours of tuition waived.

Please note, students are still required to pay for fees and books.

- **3.** High school juniors, who are Oklahoma residents, may receive up to 9 hours of tuition waived.
- **4.** High school juniors and seniors may enroll in a combined number of high school and college courses per semester not to exceed a full-time workload of 19 hours (Example: 1/2 high school credit = 3 hours).
- 5. High school students enrolled in concurrent classes at **NSU** in the fall or spring semester of their senior year, in good academic standing, <u>will not</u> have to reapply for admission if they wish to continue their education at **NSU**. The student's status will automatically change from concurrent student to freshman.
