SmarThinking, A New Way of Learning:

Tutoring update for SmarThinking:

There have been some new developments in tutoring with SmarThinking. First, there is a new student interface on the SmarThinking homepage. It includes all of the features included in the older interface, and will be easy to navigate. Second is a new product for Smarthinking called Writing Practice. With this tool, instructors select a prompt from one of four genres (narrative, persuasive, problem & solution, and response to literature) to assign to their students for practice, extra credit, or graded assignments. In addition to highlighting spelling and grammar problems, Smarthinking's Writing Practice provides critical pedagogical feedback using a rubric that addresses six aspects of writing (ideas, organization, conventions, sentence fluency, word choice, and voice).




Greetings RiverHawks!

In this edition of the SASC Newsletter we wanted to let you know about some of the ways that we are providing outreach, referral and follow-up services at NSU. In the second semester that the SASC is open we are increasing our presence on and off campus through programming, advising and travel.

This semester we have gone off campus to companies that may be relevant to your students' career choice. We will be providing educational travel to students that we have served and are serving, free of charge.
