Career SERVICES

Lauren Barela: Coordinator of Career Counseling Services

Here at the Student Academic Success Center, all of the coordinators have the opportunity to help students decide on the career path they would like to pursue after graduation. To help with this, we use a program called FOCUS 2 Assessment.

FOCUS 2 has been continually used by the Career Services department and is very helpful for students who are trying to figure out what they should major in and what Careers pair with certain majors. The FOCUS 2 Assessment is an online, interactive, self-guided career, and education planning system designed to help students make decisions about their future career goals and educa-

tion plans. FOCUS 2 will guide students through career planning readiness, work interests, values, skills, personality type, and leisure time interests. It will broaden their career options and help them discover occupations matching their personal preferences and attributes. They can also decide which career fields, majors and training programs are best and plan their career and educational pathway that will support their personal needs and goals.

At the SASC, we also guide students according to a Career Path Plan. This is a four year plan designed to direct students through awareness and assessment their freshman year, explore and narrow their sophomore year, network and confirm in their junior year, and plan and job search in their senior year. This plan will guide them to complete their career goals.

A few other career readiness resources we offer are connecting students with campus organizations, resume and cover letter building, interviewing skills, portfolio assembly, and resources when applying for jobs and internships.

The Student Academic Success Center staff strives to guide and advise students with their education goals in mind, along with preparing students for their career after graduation.

Additional Tutoring now available to NSU students

As a part of the new NSU Advising Model, the Student Academic Success Center will partner with FYE to make up the University Advising Center (UAC). The Student Academic Success Center will become a part of the University Advising Center, which is the new name for First Year Experience. The process has begun for making the official name change of FYE to the UAC on all letterhead, business cards, web-sites and etc. The implementation of the new advising model has multiple changes that include the name change, the partnering of the SASC with the University Advising Center, staffing additions, and an eventual new location of the University Advising Center.

The SASC staff will continue to work with students as they have for the past semester, but they will all be University Advisors. Combined with the five university advisors (currently in the FYE office), the SASC staff will bring the number of university advisors in the UAC to nine. For now, you will still find the SASC staff in the first floor of the library and they will continue to assist you in the ways they always have.

NSU-Tahlequah, NSU-BA, and NSU Muskogee students will see a new and improved advising model when the Fall 2013 term begins in August. The new model and the ten additional advisors will allow us to take a team approach to guiding you through your academic journey. The three advisor types; University Advisor, Academic Advisor and

Faculty Advisor will each play a specific role in the program. The University Advisor, 15 total, (five in FYE, four in SASC, four in Broken Arrow, and two in Muskogee) will work with new freshmen and undeclared students. They will provide many services designed to get you connected to campus services and guide you through your general education requirements. After you have declared your major, the Academic Advisor (twelve total, three per academic college, two in Tahlequah and one in Broken Arrow) will provide guidance. This is the newest and most exciting edition to the model. Academic Advisors will have periodic required appointments with students to ensure you are making progress toward your degree. These changes allow students with questions on classes and their academic journey to find assistance any day of the week at the University Advising Center and the College Advising Centers. The final members of the team are Faculty Advisors. They will now focus on connecting you with your anticipated career, program specific classes, and/or admission to a graduate program. The University and Academic Advisors will be focused on all University requirements, Degree Audits, and the students' academic needs at Northeastern State University.

MAP-Works is most certainly 'Making Achievement Possible' here on the campus of Northeastern State University. The fall semester proved that the surveys are helpful with almost a 100% response rate from the freshman respondents.

This semester there are extra incentives for participating in the survey. University Strategy students from fall 2011 and fall 2012 that take the survey were entered into a drawing for one of two \$125 tuition waivers both times that they take the survey this semester. They could also possibly win a \$1,500 scholarship by writing an essay about their experiences with the MAP-Works surveys.
