Call to Order: the meeting was called to order at 3:10 PM CDT

Quorum Check: quorum was not established. In addition to the President, Vice-President, and Secretary/Treasurer, 8 delegates were present [10 needed for quorum], and 7 guests.

Guests (time is typically set aside for guests who wish to address the council): there were no guests this month. This will be replaced with Faculty Council Forums moving forward.

Approval of Minutes: none.

Approval of Agenda: we did not have a quorum; we could not approve the agenda.

President Cambiano welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Old Business Items: none.

New Business Items:

- Council Meetings Structure President Cambiano introduced the elected leadership team. We have had a couple of meetings and are wanting to move forward with a new structure.
 - o Business Meetings will remain on the 1st Friday of the Month.
 - o Faculty Council Forums: These forums will provide a structured platform for meaningful dialogue, promoting open communication, collaboration, and shared governance. Held regularly, they aim to address important academic and institutional issues, share updates, gather feedback from department chairs and faculty representatives, and align on strategic priorities. By promoting transparent discussion and collective problem-solving, the forums strengthen faculty engagement in decision-making and help build a cohesive academic community.
 - Instead of having guest presentations before council meetings, we will have periodic forums that occur other than during the faculty council meeting to keep the faculty updated. These forums will allow the faculty council to serve a broader audience.
 - President Cambiano has talked with Beth Melles (of the Chairs' Council) about co-hosting these forums.
 - As to "when," open to discussion and dependent on the persons wanting to hold the forum. 2 PM, 1st Friday?
 - These forums will last less than an hour (a short presentation followed by discussion).
 - These forums will be recorded and shared.



- Coffee with FC Leadership Team
 - We want to be more accessible to the faculty. We will schedule periodic "gatherings" on all three campuses to give the faculty an opportunity for informal chats – come by and have a cup of coffee with us, voice your concerns, or tell us what's going well without having to wait for our once a month council meetings.
- Faculty <u>Handbook</u> and <u>One</u> Page with revisions (Delegate Vote) the attending delegates were asked if they had any concerns; no one did. We were unable to vote on this due to the lack of a quorum. However, there will be an email vote of the delegates to approve the revised/updated Faculty Handbook.
- Faculty Engagement Survey
 - We have heard that faculty don't feel engaged; how does Academic Affairs define engagement? How do the faculty define engagement? We will be sending out a survey to see how faculty members define engagement. What is it? What are we doing that we thing qualifies as engagement?
 - The results will be discussed at a future Faculty Council meeting.
- University Committee Representation send President Cambiano an email if you are interested in serving. Any faculty member can serve on these committees (you don't have to be a faculty council delegate). You don't even have to attend faculty council meetings, but you do need to provide a summary of the committee's actions.
 - Faculty Research Committee we need two delegates.
 - Courtney Helm volunteered to fill one position.
 - Faculty Development Committee One Delegate
- Circle of Excellence Celebration we want this to be a celebration that is sustained (despite leadership changes).
 - o Bring back certificates for those who have been nominated.
 - Have a celebration of faculty who have received degrees.
 - Provide a Faculty Showcase (poster fair or symposium) to highlight work across departments.
 - Celebrate milestones like tenure and promotion. more than just a slide at the opening meeting – a celebration.
 - Attendance has been waning the last several years and we would like to change that. , have a meal on us,
 - The plan: move this celebration to earlier in the semester (before April); the call for nominations will be sent out later this semester with final selections by mid-February.
